This includes participating in and supporting the Trails program, where they will help in guiding and educating campers about the natural environment, including activities like hiking, animal tracking, and ecological education.

- Must commit to attending the pre-camp training week.
- Must have a strong interest in sailing, kayaking and outdoor activities.
- Have excellent sailing skills and knowledge.
- Energetic, responsible, and eager to learn and develop instructional skills.
- Good communication and teamwork abilities.
- Hold a US Sailing Counselor or US Sailing Small Boat Instructor Level 1 certification (QSC is hosting a certification course in June 2025).
- Hold a current Red Cross CPR/AED/First Aid certification.
- Hold a current State Safe Boating & Personal Watercraft Certificate (NASBLA approved)
- Prior experience in sailing is preferred but not mandatory.
- Must have proficient swimming skills and understanding of water safety.

- Demonstrate leadership and a proactive attitude in undertaking responsibilities and contributing to camp activities.
- Follow all camp policies diligently, including safety protocols and dress code.
- Engage actively in staff training sessions and meetings, contributing to a collaborative team environment.
- Assist in the maintenance, care and cleaning of the docks, boats, and grounds before and after classes.
- Embrace opportunities to gain experience in outdoor education and leadership, and seek continuous personal and professional development.
- Work towards enhancing your sailing and teaching skills in a supportive, hands-on setting.
- Ensure punctuality and preparedness, bringing enthusiasm and a positive attitude to contribute to the camp's success.
